

aikanbo **K**usasenri Overlook

This 936-meter-high overlook lies on the northern outer rim of the Aso Caldera. The view from here is spectacular and the Five

Peaks of Aso seen from here supposedly resemble a reclining Bud-

dha. Under the right conditions, you may even see the rare "sea of

clouds," where a layer of clouds fills the valley and only the moun-

tain tops are visible. There is also a souvenir store and a restaurant


at Daikanbo, and it is a popular spot for star gazing.

This spot overlooks Kusasenri, one of the symbols of Aso. The volcanic smoke from the Nakadake crater can be seen from this elevation of 1,100 meters. Many tourists visit with their cameras to capture the stunning scenery. The lush green grassland and ponds formed when it rains are a beautiful sight that should not be missed.

This overlook is located along the Yamanami Highway connecting Ichinomiya-machi, Aso and Yufuin, Oita. Located on the 748-meter-high outer rim of the Aso caldera, it faces the Five Peaks of Aso and overlooks the townscape of Aso below. The sunset here is beautiful and, if you are lucky, early in the morning from spring to autumn you may glimpse the sea of clouds

Kabutoiwa Overlook

Ogidake Overlook

From the overlook at the top of Mt. Ogidake, there is a magnificent 360-degree panoramic view of the Five Peaks of Aso to the west, the Kuiu Mountains to the north, and the mountains of Sobo to the south. The Furusato Nature Trail is easy enough for beginners and is a great hiking spot. Asahi Inari Shrine is located near the summit and is marked by a series of red torii gates.
